Boy Scouts of America Explorer Post

Exploring is the Boy Scouts of America's youth development program for young men and women ages 14 through 20.

In addition to training, Explorers assist at special events, demonstrations, and on community service projects. Explorers participate in limited capacities on actual searches as well as many other aspects of search and rescue and emergency services work.

Communications Unit

The Communications Unit controls communication between team resources in the field via radio, cellular, and other communications technologies.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

CERT is about readiness, people helping people, rescuer safety, and doing the greatest good for the greatest number. GPSAR provides CERT instructors to train citizens in your community to organize and

EDUCATIONAL / OUTREACH UNIT

Details / Demonstrations

GPSAR provides speakers and/or displays at your location (time and distance permitting). Topics include canine demonstrations, search techniques, and our Lost in the Woods program for young children.

Lost in the Woods

This child survival program is presented to students, clubs, parents and interest groups across North America. Unlike the "Hug a Tree" program, Lost in the Woods provides more information and survival skills. The complete presentation is one hour and thirty minutes but can be adapted to fit a reduced time frame. The maximum group size is about fifty. The film, "Lost in the Woods" by Barry Casson, is shown as part of the presentation. Experiments taken from the book, "Lost in the Woods" by Colleen Politano, are done during each session.

TECHNICAL UNITS

Ground Search Unit

Every team member is first and foremost a ground searcher. This encompasses the basic search techniques including land navigation skills, patient care necessary to locate and stabilize victims, map and compass, and more.

Medical Responder

These are medically trained members with skills from basic first aid and CPR to doctors. Members are trained to stabilize, package, and transport patients given the limited resources in the wilderness.

Diverse Talent

CISM

For years members of the emergency services community have dealt with stress in many ways. The community now has access to critical incident stress management as well as peer support established in the area.

Peer support involves CISM trained emergency services workers helping other emergency services workers through stressful periods.

The CISM process is designed to facilitate "A normal recovery process in normal persons suffering normal effects after an encounter with an abnormal situation."

Mountain Bike Unit

The Mountain Bike Unit uses bikes to quickly search an area as well as to accompany other units such as the Mounted and Canine Units. Through extensive training, members on bikes move quickly and effectively through crowds when needed or over rough terrain.

Water Rescue Unit

The Water Search and Rescue Team is made up of GPSAR team members committed to personal development and training in order to safely and swiftly rescue and/or recover victims of water-related disasters. Water-related disasters may include but are not limited to boating accidents, floods, swimming accidents, etc.

Rope Assist Unit

The Rope Rescue Unit provides safe and effective use of technical rope rescue equipment during emergency operations to assist GPSAR personnel and other personnel who may be involved in a situation requiring a rope rescue operation.
